Edward Jenner FRS FRCPE (17 May 1749 – 26 January 1823) was an English physician and scientist who pioneered the concept of vaccines and created the smallpox vaccine, the world's first vaccine. Penicillin was isolated and purified in Oxford 1938 - 1941 It made a significant contribution to the war effort
